Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

For the last year, the parish has prayed to Our Lady of Prompt Succor under her patronage of Good Counsel.

On the Sunday after Easter Sunday, the time has come to move from a mindset of petition to a careful expression of hope and thanksgiving as we enjoy the reason of the Resurrection and look at an improving reality among us. This is an improvement that comes from hard work, great sacrifice, and true Christian patience. In the spirit of enjoying the spring season's embodiment of the resurrection of the dead, I am excited to announce a change in our prayers.

We will no longer recite the *Salve Regina*, or Hail Holy Queen, following Mass. Instead, a Novena to Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal will take place each Monday, following the daily Mass. It is a simple collection of prayers which will express our thanksgiving to God, through his Blessed Mother, for our burgeoning restoration to normal life. At the same time, we hope for God's protection and increased enlightenment as we go about our daily lives. Let us pray well. May the words of one of the novena's prayers inspire us:

"You know, O Mary, how often our souls have been the sanctuaries of your Son who hates iniquity. Obtain for us, then, a deep hatred of sin and that purity of heart which will attach us to God alone, so that our every thought, word and deed may tend to His greater glory. Obtain for us also a spirit of prayer and self-denial, that we may recover by penance what we have lost by sin and at length attain to that blessed abode where you are the Queen of angels and of men Amen."



Christ is Alive in our Youth, Young Adult and Campus Ministries as our young people grow closer to the Lord.


Christ is Alive in our schools as children learn in an environment that's vision is directed by the teachings of our Lord.

Happening Now: The So-Called "Equality Act" discriminates Against Faith & Freedom:

"Everyone deserves to be treated with respect and dignity," wrote the U.S. Catholic Bishops (USCCB) but the soon to be voted on Equality Act in many ways does the opposite and needs to be opposed." It is a radical assault on religious liberty, the right to life and privacy rights and more accurately called the "inequality act." Instead of respecting differences in beliefs and biology, marriage and sexuality, the Equality Act would: "punish faithbased organizations such as charities and schools..., force girls and women to compete against boys and men in sports, share locker rooms and shower spaces with biological men who identify as women; risk mandating taxpayers to fund abortion; force people in everyday life, especially health care workers, to support gender transition; and expand what the government considers a 'public' place, forcing even some parish halls to host functions that conflict with Catholic beliefs."
